Dear Secretary of State,

Re: Urgent need to adopt the latest Vehicle General Safety Regulation updates in the GB Type Approval Scheme

We write again as a collective of organisations and individuals committed to improving road safety across Britain, following our previous correspondence dated 9 July 2024 (copy enclosed), regarding the adoption of the latest Vehicle General Safety Regulation updates into the GB Type Approval Scheme. We also acknowledge the response from the then Transport Secretary Louise Haigh MP on 5 August 2024 (copy enclosed), in which she reassured us that 'delivering enduring improvements in road and vehicle safety' was a key priority.

Despite the strength of evidence and widespread support across sectors, we are yet to see progress towards implementing these critical safety measures. We therefore reiterate our urgent call for the Government to make a clear and time-bound commitment to adopting these updates.

As outlined in our previous letter, these regulations include features such as advanced emergency braking, intelligent speed assistance, and driver drowsiness detection - technologies that are already mandatory in the European Union and being rolled out in Northern Ireland. These features are not only proven to prevent injuries and save lives but also improve protection for more vulnerable groups including women and older adults in the event of a collision.

The public support for these measures remains strong. New research by Brake and Seeing Machines in 2025 shows that a clear majority of drivers not only value these safety features but believe they should be standard in all new vehicles sold in the UK (see enclosed report). The technology exists, it is cost-effective, and it has the potential to prevent thousands of deaths and injuries over the coming decade. The question is no longer *whether* we should act, but *when*, and we believe that moment is now.

The recent cross-party collaboration on the Automated Vehicles Act demonstrated what is possible when the Government and Parliament come together with ambition and urgency for road safety reform. We ask that this same commitment is applied to ensuring that all new vehicles on British roads meet the highest safety standards.

With every day that passes, five lives are being lost and many more are changed forever due to crashes that could have been prevented. We urge you to seize this opportunity to deliver on your promise of a new Strategic Road Safety Framework and take the essential step of adopting the latest Vehicle General Safety Regulation updates.

We remain ready to support the Department for Transport in delivering this much-needed reform and look forward to your response.
